

Our Shared Values

The Seventh-day Adventist church around the world is singing our song. Adult Sabbath School classes have begun a quarter-long study on the topic of discipleship. Why does this sound like our song? For years we have reminded ourselves that we are:

Friends helping friends become fully devoted followers of Christ.

he first part of our vision statement is the easiest for us. We like to think of ourselves as friendly and helpful. The last part we don't like to argue against, but it is also much harder to see in ourselves. What does it mean to become a fully devoted follower of Christ? What does it mean to be a disciple? For answers, we need to look back at Jewish society.

The rabbi was respected both for his knowledge of scripture, and for his understanding of what it meant in practical terms. Young men who wished to achieve a similar level of knowledge and wisdom would apprentice themselves to the rabbi. They would become disciples, who hoped one day to be seen as someone to emulate. Disciples would study with the rabbi, spend time with the rabbi, even live with the rabbi. They were willing to do almost anything that would improve their chances of becoming like the rabbi.

Jesus is our Rabbi, and all others are no more than shadowy reflections of what He is. Every disciple of Jesus has the same objective, the same focus. They want to become like Jesus. We want to become like Jesus. But this is often easier to say than it is to become.

Jesus, the Rabbi, was certainly wise in the study and application of scripture. He was also compassionate, and personally touched by every case of human need. He was selfless, serving everyone he came in contact with, even though He was still the Creator God. He was the friend of children and the outcasts of society. He was nothing like what people imagined the Messiah to be. And yet he had many followers and disciples, more than just the 12 men in His closest circle. Followers who saw in Him the truth of life, the universe, and everything.

For us to become fully devoted followers of Christ will require a lot of changes. Changes which we are not equipped to make in ourselves. Fortunately our Rabbi has provided His Holy Spirit to guide us in this journey. All we have to do is be willing to be His disciples, which means that we want to become like Him someday. And day-by-day, we will learn and become more fully devoted followers of Christ.


Ultimate Chocolate Chip Cookies (eggless)

1 cup butter 1 ¼ cups flour 1 cup brown sugar ½ tsp. salt 1 tsp. baking soda 2 cups oats

½ cup boiling water 12 oz. chocolate chips

1 tsp. vanilla



Cream butter & sugar. Dissolve soda in boiling water. Add to butter and sugar, add vanilla then mix in dry ingredients, and then chocolate chips. Drop by tablespoon onto an ungreased cookie sheet and bake for 12 minutes at 350 degrees.

New Year Greetings from Edgewood/Greater Boston Academy! There are lots of good and exciting things going on at the school as we finish up our first semester:

- We recently received the excellent news that one of our seniors, James Harper, scored an amazing 2260 on his SATs. This is high enough to qualify him for applying to Harvard University if he so chooses. James, earlier this year, also qualified as a semi-finalist for a National Merit Scholarship, one of the most prestigious scholarships in the country. James has gone through Edgewood and GBA and says he "loves" having spent his time here. He believes he is getting a quality education, and his test scores certainly back that up.
- Our music department is undergoing some changes, but a recent graduate, Rachel Pamphile, is picking up the baton and will be working with our choir for the rest of the year. This will be the third time Rachel has worked with the EW/GBA choir. A talented musician, she is also the director of the Youth Choir at the Philadelphie Church in Malden.
- Our three-year old pre-school class is growing almost on a weekly basis. Mrs. Rita Jackson opened the school year with three students and now has a dozen. She offers a Bible-based curriculum at \$450 a month, a bargain considering what day care costs! - Mr. Jackson, our 7/8th grade teacher, conducted a 3-day Basketball Clinic with his friend Anthony Bowie (former NBA player) returning as the clinician. - Upcoming events include a Mini-Week of Prayer January 9-11 with a Youth Church on the 12th, Student Week of Prayer January 28-February 1 with Youth Church on the 2nd, our Academy Day on March 6th, and our Spring Week of Prayer and Youth Church in April (TBA). 










We had to postpone our Christmas party until after Christmas due to a snow/ice storm. It was still enjoyed by all.
