Whether we are coming or going, the mission of our church to develop fully devoted followers of Christ must continue to advance. Here are a few ideas to help us toward that goal.

- ✍ Take advantage of the church's summer programming: Weekly services, Camp Meeting, fellowship events, and Vacation Bible School. Regular contact with the church and its faith building programs will help you grow strong through the summer months.
- ✍ Remember the financial commitments you have made to advance the ministry of our church and to help pay off our mortgage. When you prepare for those summer excursions, ask yourself, "What would I give if I were at church this Sabbath?" and then send a check to the church. - ✍ Be sure to check the church website www.mvsda.org/ regularly. The church bulletin and announcements are uploaded to the website each week. It's an easy way to keep up with the life of our church.
- ✍ Find creative ways to share Christ with others. Distribute tracts and magazines. Practice your "Contagious Christian" skills as you move conversations from the casual to the spiritual. Invite your friends and family to join us for worship, recreational activities, and evangelistic programs such as the Vacation Bible School.
- ✍ Pray for your church and pray for our church families. Pray for their safety as they travel. Pray for a growing closeness between the members of our families. Pray for the witness of our church. Pray for our church leaders.

While the summer step may slow the pace, we must not stop. We are friends helping friends become fully devoted followers of Christ, and that driving vision never takes a vacation.

GOD HAS AN ANSWER

Let's face it: life is fraught with choices, some of which are not all that clear-cut. Though the Bible is crystal clear about certain moral principles and doctrines, there are other subtle, yet important issues it does not discuss in detail. What is the best way to rear our children; to relate and witness to non-Christians; to deal with concerns about financial debt, credit cards, and savings; to know God's will concerning a job change or relocation? These and a thousand other questions should make us ask the Lord daily to teach us the right way to live. God has an answer to every challenge we face, and He will reveal it to us as we pray in a childlike fashion. As a father leads his child by the hand, the Lord will guide us day by day. Our struggle is to slow down long enough to spend time with God to do two things: ask and listen. It helps, of course, if we realize that we are not as smart as we think. We really do need the Holy Spirit's help to navigate through life.

Today prayer for personal guidance is almost a lost art. Our tendency is to run around doing what we think best and then ask God to bless our activity. We can learn a lesson from the leaders of Israel who approached the prophet Jeremiah in the midst of a political and military crisis. Their request was simple: "Pray that the Lord your God will tell us where we should go and what we should do" (Jeremiah 43:3).

God's plan for our lives includes the "where" we should go and the "what" we should do. Waiting before Him for direction is never a waste of time. As we pray, we will also learn that "less" is often "more" as the Lord guides our steps. Ten words spoken to someone at God's prompting will accomplish more than one hundred of our own.

If Jesus, the Son of God, had to pray in order to find strength, what does that mean for us? Think how different our past might have been if in every circumstance and trial we had always kept praying, just as Jesus did. The problem is not God's refusal to give us grace but rather man's refusal to ask God for the strength to withstand sin's onslaught. In the garden of Gethsemane, Jesus cautioned His disciples, as He still cautions us, against the laziness that leads to danger. "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak." (Matthew 26:41) Some temptations are part of every day living, but others can be avoided if we learn to do two things: become spiritually alert and form the habit of prayer.

As we have seen on May 17, 2004, a group of 14 people

assembled in the MVC and prayed specifically for one particular thing, we were united in prayer, we had the earnest desire that God would intervene, and with this childlike faith we pleaded with God. He heard and answered that same evening! What is stopping us from meeting like this on a regular basis and bringing to God our specific needs in earnest heartfelt prayer? Why is it that we can change our busy schedules when certain situations arise, but we go through our trials and struggles and carry our burdens by ourselves, when we know that there is strength in numbers? Why don't we take advantage of the power that is available to us?

We know battles are to be fought every day. A great warfare is going on over every soul, between the prince of darkness and the Prince of light...As God's agents we are to yield ourselves to him, that He may plan and direct and fight the battle for us, with our cooperation. The Prince of life is at the head of His work. He is to be with us in our daily battle with self, that we may be true to principle; the passion, when warring for the mastery, maybe subdued by the grace of Christ; that we come off more than conqueror through Him that had loved us. Jesus has been over the ground. He knows the power of every temptation. He knows just how to meet every emergency, and how to guide us through every path of danger. Then why not trust Him? (cc 117.4)

We know this in our head but it is not rooted deep in our heart. Let's join hands together and encourage each other to come before the Lord in prayer on a weekly basis. What do you think? Are you willing to join us and experience God's presence? Please let me know so we can organize it.

In the Kitchen

Gazpacho Soup

3 cups ripe tomatoes
 2 cups cucumbers, peeled & diced
 2 stalks celery, diced
 1/2 green bell pepper, seeded & diced
 1 red bell pepper, seeded & diced
 3 green onions, sliced or 2 Tbsp. dry onion flakes
 2 Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil
 1 1/2 - 2 Tbsp. lemon juice
 1/2 tsp Celtic Sea Salt (optional)
 All-Purpose Seasoning to taste
 1/4 cup soup stock, optional

Place 1 1/2 tomatoes, 1/4 cup soup stock in a food processor and puree. Place in a glass container, add remaining vegetables, stir in olive oil, lemon juice, Celtic Sea Salt and All Purpose Seasoning to taste. Cover and chill. Do not heat. This soup is served cold. Garnish each bowl with a few parsley flakes.

Ambrosia

1 Pint of plain yogurt (or sour cream)
 2 Cans of drained pineapple chunks
 2 Cans of drained mandarin oranges
 1/2 Bag of shredded coconut
 (If desired 1/2 bag of mini marshmallows)
 Blueberries to taste
 Strawberries - sliced to taste

Mix together and refrigerate overnight. Before serving add fresh blueberries and sliced strawberries.

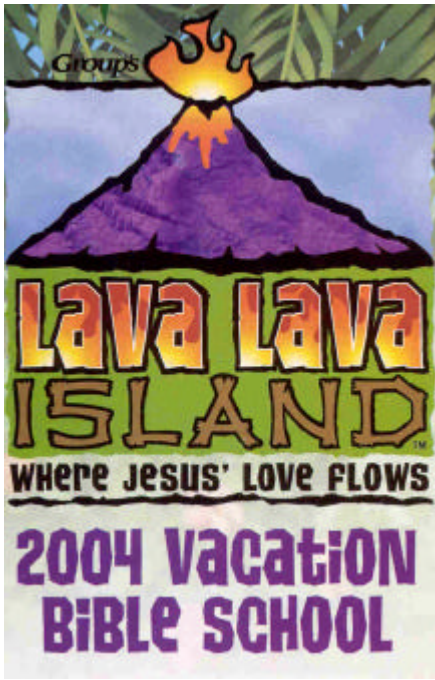
