

"Forming A Shared Vision"

The Israelites were ex-slaves and out of the habit of taking responsibility for themselves and their community. To prepare for a time when Moses would not be around to guide and instruct them, God provided a solution to keep the lessons alive and vibrant. Their fractured society needed something to keep them together and to preserve their identity into future generations. The method was so important that it was recorded twice in the book of Deuteronomy alone. It was also simple enough that everyone could follow it successfully. Tell the stories. Tell them to your children. Talk about it when you are at home and when you are away. Share them in the morning and in the evening. Keep the reminders posted at your doors and gates. God promised that as the Israelites diligently shared their stories with their children, that He would bless them and they would prosper as a community. This promise is available to us, even today. If we look back at where we started from and where we are today, there are many stories to be shared. (Continued on Page 2) We have fallen out of the habit of telling the stories and reminding each other of what God has done for and through us. Many of our church family were not present when God blessed more abundantly than any of us could imagine. Some missed the stories of how God worked in the lives of individual members to mature them in faith. We haven't shared the stories, and we haven't shared the challenges we face together. Those who haven't been told cannot be expected to share a passion to grow and develop our church.

We have many challenges and opportunities ahead which need all of us to be fully invested. There are dreams of retiring our church mortgage early, and ending concern about making the monthly payments. There are dreams of starting a school, of sharing the Good News with our Dracut community, of growing so successfully that a new church can be planted. But none of these dreams will become real unless we share them, and share how God has worked in and through us.

In reviewing our past history, having traveled over every step of advance to our present standing, I can say, Praise God! As I see what the Lord has wrought, I am filled with astonishment, and with confidence in Christ as leader. We have nothing to fear for the future, except as we shall forget the way the Lord has led us, and His teaching in our past history. (*Life Sketches of Ellen G. White*)

1 pkg. broccoli coleslaw mix

- 2 pkgs. Ramen noodles (mushroom flavor)
- 1 cup slivered almonds, toasted
- 1 cup sunflower seeds
- 1 bunch green onions, chopped
- 1/2 red pepper, chopped
- 1/2 cup Craisins



- 3/4 cup canola and olive oil, mixed
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup rice vinegar
- 1 flavoring packet from Ramen noodles

Directions:

Crush noodles in packages and mix with almonds & sunflower seeds Mix slaw, onions, red pepper and Craisins Make dressing about 1/2 hour before serving. Mix all together. It tastes better after the dressing has been on at least 1/2 hour.
