This Fall we will launch two important public evangelism initiatives. Kenneth Cox, one of our premier evangelists in North America, will hold public evangelistic meetings in our Church the weekend of October 31 - November 2. As soon as those meetings are complete, we will launch phase two of our outreach thrust: A weekly series of 6 or 7 small Bible study groups that will be hosted in our church and in member homes across the valley. These study groups will provide circles of friendship that will enable us, along with our seeker and new member friends, to explore the truth of Jesus as it is found in the Bible doctrines of our church.

Here is how you can become involved:

- ✓ Be There. Block out the entire weekend of October 31
 November 2 for this important evangelistic event.

 Meetings will be held on Friday evening, Sabbath, and Sunday. We need you in the pews with our guests. We need you providing a variety of services from greeting and record keeping, to materials distribution and food service. We need every member to roll up their sleeves and help us make the connection with each guest God will bring to us.
- ✓ Pray. Pray for those participating in the Video Bible School--our seed sowing and nurturing event in preparation for these harvest meetings. Pray for the 5,000 homes that will receive our handbill in the mail.

- Pray for your Pastor and Church leaders as they put the local program pieces together. Pray for Kenneth Cox and his team as they travel here and make the gospel presentations. Pray that the Holy Spirit will fill this place and bless this congregation with new convert growth.

group jumped, shouted, and sang their praises to music that wouldn't let you stand still.





Evangelism He Died !!!

He died! My son my son DIED!

We hear it every day in the news. Some tragedy happens - a car accident, a serious cancer disease or other injury causing death within a few weeks and we are shocked. The only option we see is to pray - we ask God for his support, for healing, for emotional support for the relatives and for the right words to share with them in this difficult situation.

During these times our church experiences answered prayers - and we need to be honest as well - we saw others not being fulfilled at all. Prayer during this time has tremendous impact: It helps us to get closer to God, it unites us as family and church and we show friendship with each other -- how much we care.

On the other hand we need to admit, that death is the most normal thing on earth. Everyone dies and everyone will experience death of his or her relatives. We don't have any control over it - we only can delay it until 120 years are reached (Genesis 6:3). If we pray for healing of a deadly disease - we actually pray only for a delay of the death date.

What I'm most worried about is eternal death. This is actually something, we can have influence - either we are dead forever or we live forever in God's kingdom. We actually can decide which direction we want to go - and this not only affects 120 years - it affects eternity.

Nearly 10 years ago I learned an important lesson. I was in the Emergency Room lying on the table. Because of the urgency the doctors didn't wait for the narcotics to take affect. They started cutting and I knew I could die right there. But one thing happened - on one side I got calm, because I knew that I'm saved - but on the other side I recalled all my friends, former classmates and coworkers and noticed that I haven't told them about the gospel of Jesus and eternal life!

Why is it that we care so much about an issue that we can only delay for a few decades, but we really don't pray for the salvation of our friends and family, classmates and coworkers? Is it because we got used to it, since there was not a sudden tragedy but a steady problem? Is it because we fear their responses now more than the responses we hear from them when Jesus comes back?

Take some time to think about these 3 questions carefully:

- 1. Who are the friends I would love to see in heaven with me?
- 2. How can I make time for daily Bible study and prayer, so God can teach me how to guide them spiritually?
- 3. What are the issues I need to bring to God, so I can invite them to the evangelistic meetings with Kenneth Cox Oct 31st Nov 2nd?



PRAYER

Today I would like to start a series on Prayer. Let's listen in to the disciples as they approached Jesus. Luke 11:1 "Lord, teach us to pray."

It is still true today that disciples who seek Him have the same request. Yes, to pray--this is what we need to be taught. Though in its beginnings prayer is so simple that the feeblest child can pray, it is at the same time the highest and holiest work to which man can rise. Prayer is fellowship with the unseen and most Holy One. It is the secret of power and life not only for us, but also for others, for the church, and for the world. It is through prayer that God has given us the right to take hold of Him and His strength. It is through prayer that the promises wait for their fulfillment.

How speedily are we deceived into resting in a form of prayer, while the power is still missing? Our early training, the teaching of the church, the influence of habit, the stirring of emotions— how easily these lead to prayer which has no spiritual power and achieves little. Who wouldn't cry out for someone to teach them true prayer that takes hold of God's strength and achieves much. Only the spirit of God can enable us to do it right. Jesus trains those of His redeemed ones who especially desire to have power in prayer.

God, teach us to pray. We have read in your word about the power Your believing people of long ago had when they prayed. We know for certain that the power can be ours too. The promises are for us; the powers and gifts of the heavenly world are for us.

It is true we have God's word with its clear and true promises, but sin has so darkened our minds that we don't always know how to apply the Word.

Even when we know what to ask for, so much is still needed to make prayer acceptable. It must be to the glory of God, in full surrender to His will, in full assurance of faith, in the name of Jesus, and with a perseverance that, if need be, refuses to be denied. All this must be learned. It can only be done at the feet of Jesus. By His Holy Spirit He has access to our hearts and teaches us to pray by showing us the sin that hinders the prayer, or by giving us the assurance that we please God.

In the Kitchen

Granola Cereal

7 cups Oatmeal (small container - Old Fashioned Oats)

1/2 cup whole wheat flour

1 cup wheat germ

1 1/2 cups coconut

2 teaspoon salt

1 cup unsalted nuts

Mix above ingredients in a large bowl and set aside.

1/2 cup sunflower oil

1/2 cup warm water

1 1/2 tablespoon vanilla

3/4 cup brown sugar

Mix above 4 ingredients in a blender. Add to dry ingredients & mix thoroughly.

Bake on cookie sheets @ 250 degrees stirring every 15-20 minutes until golden brown & crisp, approximately $1\ 1/2$ hours.
